CHURCH ACTIVITIES

There are a number of activities that run during the week in the church. You are welcome to come along to these.

PRAYER

Prayer is crucial to the life of our church. The Intercessors meet on Mondays and Wednesdays at 6.00am for 1 hour in the church office.

On Friday evenings the Prayer team meet at 7.00pm in the church office, and also at 10.15am on Sunday mornings at the Stowe Centre.

There is a monthly Prayer evening on the first Friday of each month. This is from 7.00pm until 10.00pm. The venue for this meeting is the Church Office.

WOMEN'S MINISTRY

The Women's Ministry meets on the third Saturday of each month, from 10.30am until 12.30pm. This group meets at the Church Office. The focus of the meeting is to empower and support women in their lives.

MEN'S MINISTRY

The Men's Ministry run activities over the course of the year, providing opportunities for men to get together and support each other.

WOMEN'S NETBALL

Every Tuesday evening at 7.00pm, a group of women meet at Westminster Academy Sports Centre for a game of netball. You are welcome to join them.

DISCIPLESHIP

Over the course of the year there are discipleship classes running on baptism, church membership, spiritual MOT's, and from time to time, an extended course for Growing Leaders. Daniela Francisquini can provide more information on these activities.

WORSHIP

Our worship team lead us each Sunday during our services. For more information about this speak to Felicia Asiedu or David Singh who will be happy to discuss getting involved.

PASTORAL CARE

We offer support to people in the church through our Fellowship Groups, and also through support from the Leadership Team. If you would like to discuss a pastoral situation, please contact Pastor Jem Sewell or one of the Core Leaders.

MISSION AND EVANGELISM

As a church we are involved in mission in the local community. Hanna Sintim is a Community Pastor working with Urban Expression. We have been involved in the Notting Hill Carnival. We run Alpha courses from time to time.

PARISH NURSING

Parish Nurses offer whole person healthcare through the local church. Elizabeth Welch is a Parish Nurse, and can be contacted if you wish to talk through a health need. She runs The Daniel Plan group, CAP Money Course with Tara Ojo, First Aid training courses over the course of the year, and a bereavement course when required.

SCHOOLS WEEK

At Christmas and Easter we run sessions for local primary schools. Easter Cracked and Christmas Unwrapped give children the real meaning of the celebrations.

CHURCH SOCIAL EVENTS

We try to organise times for the church family to spend time together. There is tea and coffee served after all our services. We have church lunches about once a month on a Sunday, and always have Christmas Dinner together.

INFORMATION ON THE CHURCH AND LEADERSHIP

We are a group of Christians who gather from across London united in our love for God and our desire to show God's love to people around us. We are a culturally diverse church community. We are currently meeting for our worship services at The Stowe Centre, while our church building is being rebuilt to provide accessible premises for the future. INFORMATION ON GIVING

Giving is not just about money. God blesses us in many different ways through the gifts, abilities and time he has given us. Every person in the church is unique and brings their own blend of skills and gifts. members commit themselves to sharing in the work of the church. If you would like to get involved, please speak with one of the leaders.

INFORMATION ON TITHES AND OFFERINGS

Another way God blesses us is through providing for our daily needs. The Bible teaches us that we are to give back to God a portion of what he has given to us. This can be called a tithe or an offering. How much you give is between you and God. The bible does give a guideline of giving one tenth of our income to God (see Numbers 18:21-32 and Malachi 3:8-10.) However, you need to decide this for yourself.

If you would like to commit yourself to giving to the church then you can do so in one of the following ways:

- Through a standing order from your bank account. This is easily set up through online banking. The church account details can be obtained from one of the leaders.
- Through the weekly offerings by cash gifts or cheques.

GIFT AID

giftaidit If you are a UK Taxpayer, you can boost your donation by 25p of Gift Aid for every £1 you tithe. This makes a significant difference to the church at no cost to yourself. Your tithes and offerings need to be identified, so either give through standing order, by cheque, through the weekly envelope scheme or occasional gift aid envelopes. INFORMATION ON SAFEGUARDING

Westbourne Park Baptist Church is committed to the nurture, protection and safekeeping of everyone, especially children, young people and adults who are vulnerable.

We have a Safeguarding Policy to ensure good practice guidelines are applied to all our groups. We run training every year for our staff and volunteers.

Geoff Biggs and Elizabeth Welch are the Responsible Persons for Safeguarding in the Church and Family Centre, overseen by our Senior Pastor, Jem Sewell. Please speak to one of them if you have concerns about the safety of anyone in our church family or in the community.

SAFEGUARDING IN PRACTICE ON SUNDAYS AT THE STOWE

If you are a parent you are responsible for your child's safety during church services, unless you hand this care over to a group leader. Please remember that this is a public building, open to everyone. Ensure you know where your child is at all times, including accompanying them to the toilets. Children's groups are run for part of our services. Children under the age of 11 with leave the hall with their group leaders. At the end of the service the children in Sunday School will be returned to the main hall by the teachers. Parents need to collect younger children from the crèche.

INFORMATION ON FELLOWSHIP GROUPS

Fellowship Groups are small groups of people who meet together, usually weekly, in a home or local venue. It is an informal time of worshiping together, sharing God's word, and applying it to our lives. We pray for each other and for the things and people that are important to us. We also try to focus outward, praying for the community and world situations.

We aim to keep Jesus central to the Fellowship Group and everything that happens focuses back on him.

We provide pastoral care through our Fellowship Groups, because we can really get to know each other and can care practically and in prayer throughout the week.
